This will extend the length of the season for Beaver Lodge to be enjoyed.

These are a safe economical way to provide heat on a steady basis. With the goal to rent a cabin during the winter, this is a solution with immediate results. Cut a hole and plug it in! It will give opportunity to accommodate larger groups during the winter as White Pine is often not quite big enough for some of those youth and church retreats.

SOUND BAFFLES FOR THE DINING HALL \$2,655 1,100 1,555

One comment we often hear from retreat guests is that it is too noisy in the dining hall. Acoustic Panels Canada is willing to contribute \$500 worth of product so we can install panels on the ceiling to improve acoustical properties of the room.

By installing some panels in stages as we are financially able to will help to eliminate the echo.

REFURBISH A ROOM IN WHITE PINE

Currently there are two rooms completed and nine rooms and four bathrooms to go! Guests favour the renovated rooms and White Pine Lodge is available all year so it is a great investment.

\$1,300 worth of material renews a bathroom with low flush toilet, ceramic floor and baseboard, upgraded exhaust fan, sink, taps, paint and a heater. \$3,000 worth of material renews a room including a new beds, mattresses, bedding, heater, flooring, lighting, desk renewal, paint and trim.
