### 2019 Camp Theme:

#### PEACE WORKS-EMPOWERING THE NEXT GENERATION OF PEACEMAKERS

This summer, campers will have the opportunity to discover what peace is, beyond a 'best case scenario'.

The Peace Works curriculum allows campers to question peace and conflict. Why do we have conflict? How can we move towards peace? How does my faith fit into all this?

Each daily theme invites campers to think about peace and peacemaking from a different perspective: hospitality, community-building, conflict, peace through modelling God's love, active (and radical) peacemaking, and Jesus' assuring benediction.

While either Bible study sessions or worship are scheduled daily, all camp activities reflect meaningful opportunities to serve, explore God's creation, and embrace the gifts of Gracefield Camp's community.

Our prayer for this summer is that campers return to the world having learnt how to serve their communities to promote and build peace through firmly rooted faith.

## Campin' at Camp Cairn

This spring some of our senior summer staff had the opportunity to attend the annual Ontario Presbyterian Camp Conference (OPCC) located at Camp Cairn outside of Baysville, Ontario. This conference is an opportunity for various camps to come together to share ideas for running a successful kids camp. The Gracefield staff had the opportunity to try out new games, learn new songs, and connect with other young adults through times of worship. Discussions were held regarding important topics such as gender inclusion, marketing, waste reduction, wilderness programming, session planning and much more.

Callum "Zazu" Richardson, Gracefield's Wilderness Director, had this to say:

"It was cool to see how the other camps were run. I attended a session on wilderness programming, and not only did I get some new ideas about how to run our wilderness program, but I also learned about the strengths and weaknesses that Gracefield has in comparison to the other camps. OPCC definitely gave us some good long term information."

The program staff weren't the only ones who attended the OPCC. Interim Managing Co-Director, Diana Mahaffy, also attended to learn about the operational side of the other camps. In Diana's words, "It was good to make connections with other camp directors. It was comforting to learn that the other camps face very similar operational problems. Our operations seem very comparable to much larger camps."

This experience has brought new insight and connections to our staff, that will be used to better our camp as a whole.

A 'Gracefield Guardian' is someone who currently donates to GCCRC using preauthorized remittances (PAR), also known as a 'PAR donor'. This document defines the discounts to which Guardians are entitled and how they are to be administered.

- 1. Monthly donations of \$5 or more qualify.
- 2. Guardians are entitled to 10% discounts on:
  - a) Tent and trailer site rentals, except for seasonal trailer site fees;
  - b) Lodgings, including White Pine, Beaver, Jolly Roger, the Manager's Cottage and the eventual Cabin Village; and/or
  - c) Meals taken in dining hall.
- 3. Discounts are not provided to PAR donors for other items such as merchandise, equipment rentals, children's or Family Camp fees, or firewood.
- 4. To receive a Guardian discount, the Guardian needs to be currently enrolled as a PAR donor when the Guardian or family members visit Gracefield.
- 5. The discounts are applicable to discountable costs incurred by the Guardian, his/her spouse/partner, and his/her children under 19 years of age whether or not the Guardian is one of the Camp guests on a particular occasion. Guardian discounts do not apply to other guests who may visit the Camp with the Guardian.
- 6. To receive a Guardian discount, the Guardian needs to self-identify as a PAR donor when making a booking or, at the latest, when making a payment. Camp staff will make best efforts attempt to identify Guardians when preparing invoices, but are not obliged to identify all Guardians.
- 7. Once an invoice has been paid, refunds or credits unfortunately cannot be provided for Guardian discounts that were missed.
- 8. Guardian discounts are only applicable when the Guardian or an immediate family member books and pays directly rather than via a third party such as a church. Guardian discounts are not available for group rentals.
- 9. When charitable tax receipts are issued for PAR donations, the following CRA rules will be applied:
  - a) If the value of the discounts received in the tax year exceeds 10% of the total of the PAR donations or \$75, then the value of the discounts will be deducted from the PAR donation amount to arrive at the 'eligible charitable donation' for tax purposes.
  - b) If the value of the discounts received in the tax year exceeds 80% of the total of the PAR donations, then no tax receipt will be issued at all. A letter will be sent to the PAR donor explaining why no receipt is issued.

10. Guardians may decline to take applicable discounts.
