

After an hour or so, she retrieved a lovely steaming, sizzling package of goodness, and sat and enjoyed her late night snack.

There's nothing like Campfire Potatoes!



PAULA'S CAMPFIRE POTATOES + ONIONS

2-3 lbs white or red potatoes1 medium to large onion6-8 slices bacon1-2 tbsp olive oil

Cut onion and potatoes into chunks.

Lay out foil into a "pan".

Lay 3-4 slices of bacon on the bottom, then add onions and potatoes.

Add oil and top with remaining bacon.

Wrap foil tightly.

Grill 20-25 minutes and then flip foil packet over and cook an additional 2-3 minutes.

MATT SAYERS Maintenance Assistant


